

# Sketches of Members of Medical Staff

DR. PAUL KAYE, head of Pediatric Service... Offices in Cold Spring and Beacon... Resident of Cold Spring... Married to Cathy Duke, who has taught Latin American history at Vassar College... They have 3-year-old son, Noah.

Kaye, a cum laude graduate of Cornell University, received his medical degree from the State University of New York Upstate Center in Syracuse in 1976. He served his pediatrics internship and residency at the University of Wisconsin Hospitals in Madison from 1977 to 1979.

After his residency, Kaye took a year and a half off to be a househusband, caring for his son while his wife worked.

He joined the staffs of Vassar Brothers and Butterfield Hospitals in 1980 and serves on the Butterfield emergency-room staff as well as pursuing his specialty.




DR. PHILIP ORGAN, podiatrist... Has been associated with Butterfield since 1974, when he moved to Fishkill.
